

Preaching, Teaching and Serving in Christ's Name.

Introduction:

Because the church is a human organization, and has a tendency to forget its purpose, and how it is to live out the Gospel in the world, it is important that the congregation regularly look in the mirror and evaluate what God's call and direction is for their future. The Church Constitution also calls for the Congregational Council to conduct regular visioning/strategic planning for the congregation. Most importantly, the church conducts a visioning/strategic planning process to help it seek out God's vision and plan for the life and future of its ministry and its people.

For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. (Jeremiah 29:11)

It is with that goal in mind that in October of 2018, the Congregational Council of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church established a Visioning/Strategic Planning Team consisting of 11 active members that represent the many different generations that make up the congregation of this church. Curtis Boland, Lucy Peters, Pam Bush, Frank Lake, Julie Haltiwanger, Wendy Shealy, Sheri Wicker, Phillip Allison, Ted Arnold, Tony Shell, Daniel Boland make up the team.

Under the guidance of Pastor Collins, the team began its journey on November 6, 2018, working to help the congregation discern God's vision for its future. From the very beginning, we agreed that the process would not be about any one person, the pastor, or groups within the congregation. It would be about God and focused on what God wants for the congregation. The process would begin and end with prayer. Our time would not just be to meet and plan, but to seek God's guidance and direction in the purpose we as a team were charged to complete. It is God who has the vision and our responsibility is to help the congregation discover that vision and how we live that out in the world for Him.

The Process:

Through our monthly meetings, we worked to discover the best possible means available to help the congregation intentionally consider each part of the vision process.

<u>Values</u>: We can't understand where we are going if we don't understand where we have been, or who we are. Shaped by where we've been and what is important to us as God's people, our values direct the purpose for which we exist; why we gather and serve as God's people. What do we believe is important to us? Standards, truths, principles, behavior, moral codes.

Mission: Once we understand who we are, we have to discern why we are here, why do we exist, and what is our purpose? This is something that is ongoing, something we strive to live out and pass on. It is what makes us different from other organizations.

Vision: Once we have discovered who we are and our purpose for existing, then we define how we live out our purpose through the ministry of God here at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. What is God's vision for the ministry of our church? What does God want us to look like, do, and focus on in the coming years?

Findings:

Who We Are: Holy Trinity Lutheran Church is a traditional congregation which believes God's Holy Word as revealed through the Scriptures. Following Christ's example, we seek to share the Scriptures as we worship, teach, and serve in fellowship and love.

What We Do: Preaching, Teaching and Serving in Christ's name.

How We Live Out Our Purpose In The World: We are an active congregation, who are believers of Christ, and seek out how best to help others discover the love of Christ in their lives.

Values: Who We Are

Our first order of business was to help the congregation discern its values and what it felt was important to its life and ministry in the community and world. This led to the team going out to the congregation in worship, Sunday School classes, and fellowship groups utilizing a survey (see appendix) to ascertain what they felt were the values of the congregation. Responses from the congregation were then collated and categorized into six main groups forming the core values of the congregation: worship, teaching, study, love, service, and fellowship. From these core values, the team developed a statement that summarized the core values and defined who we are and what is important to us as a congregation. This information was then shared with the congregation during worship on a special "Values Sunday."

Our Core Values:

- 1. Worship: We gather to give thanks and praise to God for all He has done for us through our Savior Jesus Christ.
- 2. **Teach:** Through God's Word, we make the love of Christ known to a lost world as we encounter others every day.
- 3. Study: Through the Holy Spirit, we seek to understand the Word of God and apply it to our lives.
- 4. Love: We seek to follow the Lord's command to love God and love our neighbor.
- 5. Serve: In the example of Christ, we seek to meet the needs of all God's creation.
- 6. Fellowship: We gather to build lasting relationships of love, care, and support.

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Values Statement:

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church is a traditional congregation which believes God's Holy Word as revealed through the Scriptures. Following Christ's example, we seek to share the Scriptures as we worship, teach, and serve in fellowship and love.

Mission: What We Do

Once the team completed the Values Statement and felt it contained the essence of what the congregation was telling us through the survey responses, we moved forward with the process of determining what the congregation felt God's mission and purpose was for the church. Again, we turned to survey responses and discussion with church members to gather the needed information to develop a comprehensive Mission Statement that would describe God's mission for the church and guide our ministry in the coming years. We determined there was no better way to describe the mission and purpose God has for the members and ministry of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church than what had been its guiding purpose for many years.

Preaching, Teaching and Serving in Christ's Name

<u>Preaching</u>: It is in worship and the sharing of the Gospel message of our Savior Jesus Christ that we are strengthened and enabled to be His disciples and go into the world to witness to God's love and help others experience His abundant life. "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ that the man of God^[b] may be complete, equipped for every good work." (2 Timothy 3:16)

<u>Teaching</u>: In the study of God's Word, we hear proclaimed the truth of our God and His victory for our lives in Christ Jesus. We grow closer to our Savior and better understand our call to live our lives as His disciples in the world. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20)

Serving: All believers are blessed with gifts and talents and are called to use these gifts in a life of service to our Lord. It is here that we are blessed to be Christ's hands and feet to the lost, the needy, the lonely, and the forgotten that Jesus Himself came to save. In serving, we give of ourselves as Christ gave to us, following His command. "For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you." (John 13:15)

In Christ's Name: In this statement, we proclaim to all who listen why we do what we do. It is not for our benefit or for what we can get out of it, but that Christ may be known and praised for all he has done for us. As the Apostle Paul tells the Ephesians, "We live for the praise of God's glory." (Ephesians 1:12)

Vision: How We Live It Out

The Team then turned to helping the congregation discern how God wants us to live out this mission. A visioning Sunday was held during worship where the team used a survey to encourage the congregation to dream dreams and ask themselves, "What are your hopes for the future of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church?" and "What is one need you would like to see addressed as it relates to...preaching, teaching, and serving?" We received numerous responses that gave us a broad spectrum of hopes, dreams, and needs the members felt God was calling the congregation to address over the coming years.

As we began to collate and categorize the information provided through the surveys, several themes concerning the congregation's hope for the future stood out. Utilizing these themes, the team produced a summary statement of the vision that was provided by the congregation in the surveys.

We are an active congregation who are believers of Christ seeking how best to help others discover the love of Christ in their lives.

The congregation expressed their hope for the future with these themes.

- That we will continue to preach, teach, and serve in Christ's name.
- That we provide a future for the children of our church
- That we show God's love to others by carrying out the obligations we promised as we joined the church
- That we still exist in 20 years
- That we continue to trust in God to make us a strong, caring, and compassionate church

(All responses may be found in the appendix at the end of this document.)

Specific themes the congregation recognized as things needed to be addressed in the future are:

I. Involvement/Fellowship

- a. Improve attendance at ministry events and increase membership
- b. Improve involvement and participation in the ministries of the congregation
- c. Maintain unity of the congregation by serving each other and the community

II. Learning/Teaching

- a. Improve attendance at Sunday School and spiritual growth opportunities
- b. Provide meaningful opportunities to increase Biblical knowledge and application
- c. Provide worship opportunities for all to give praise and thanks to God

III. Outreach/Service

- a. Serve the Lord and spread His love within our community and world
- b. Be more welcoming and open to all generations in the church and community
- c. Improve communication of activities and events

IV. Buildings/Facilities

- a. Upgrade facilities to meet ministry needs of the congregation
- b. Use technology to enhance and assist the ministries of the congregation
- c. Allow space for future staffing needs

Summary:

Sometimes when you begin a journey, you can't see what's truly important because all the big things that might be blocking your view. We know what we are looking for and keep our eyes open for what we want to see. Yet, it's in those little things that aren't as clear and visible along the journey, that we find true meaning, purpose, and what's really important. That is really where we find God's plan for our life.

We believe that in this vision God has given the congregation, you will discover people who believe that worshipping our Lord, teaching and learning about God's love, studying God's Word, loving God and others, and serving in the example of Christ Jesus is important. You will find people who believe God put this church in the Little Mountain community to preach His Word, teach others about His love, and to serve others as Christ has served us.

Through the efforts of the Vision Team to make this process about God and seeking the congregation's input, God has given to us a vision for ministry that can not only put us on the path to fulfill His mission, but also help bring renewed meaning and purpose to the congregation. In this document, you will find we have the heart and soul of what the congregation told us was important as God's people. Although it doesn't identify any big programs or major projects, it identifies the true things the congregation feels are important and needed to help us grow as God's people and move forward making disciples for Him.

Bold and underlined headings are specific themes identified and underlined headings are subcategories of those themes.

That the over arching focus of our ministry would be making disciples for Christ. In that everything we do be evaluated under the pretense that if it does not help us do that then we would not do it. And that over the next five years the congregation would develop a process where by each member of the church would take part in learning about and growing in their ability to be a disciple of Christ.

That our congregation's ministry would make a commitment to look outside itself and it's walls to go be with the people and share Christ in the community rather than waiting for them to come to us.

Some more peppier music, hymnals could be a little faster and heart felt.

I would like for us to become more of an outreach church. We do alot of great things to serve the Lord. However, I feel we need to be out in our communities more. My main concern is finding a way to hold on to our young adults and keep them involved and attending their church. I feel we don't have to compromise teaching the Truth of God's Word. We do need to figure out and adapt it to appeal and retain and gain young adults. They are who will carry on the legacy of Holy Trinity. I am thankful that they are at least going other places, but we need them to remain involved at Holy Trinity plus we know what is being taught.

Expand community outreach to include everyone.

Thrive and grow, bring people back who have felt/feel unheard/unfulfilled from their time here.

2 - A. Preaching (worship, living, praying, devotions, spiritual growth, etc.)

That our worship leaders would strive to help our worship be more welcoming to visitors and meaningful for all generations. i.e, the hymnals are confusing to visitors, the routine of the liturgy makes worshipers subject to rote participation and the music, which is good and the choir is great, but it doesn't cover a wide range of the needs of those who worship with us on Sunday.

Discuss gospel reading in more detail. Teach gospel verse by verse. What is the meaning behind it? What do I need to learn? Is there any convictions?

I think we definitely need to bring back the early service that we had back in the summer. While I greatly appreciate all of the hard work and dedication the music team puts in, I do feel we do need to speed up and sing more uplifting music. Lots of times it is so long and drawn out i feel like when will it ever end instead of feeling like I am rejoicing and praising God through music. Also, I know it shouldn't matter how long we sit on the pew because Jesus died on the Cross. He gladly sacrificed His Life for us. However, i feel we do need to make the service not so long. It is hard to sit still and pay attention for much longer than an hour. I think if we just went back to the early service, it would take care of alot of the issues without having to change the 10:30am service.

Service needs to be more Moving/spiritual, do not need to feel like a robot. Do not feel as if my "cup is full", Also Early service offering, for people who like to get going early.

2 - B. Teaching (learning, growing in God's Word, Bible study, Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, etc.)

Expand Sunday school. Reach out to kids and promote Sunday school. STOP expanding preschool, it is taking over everything. Already taken over several locations that were used by the church for church activities!

One of our biggest concern is Sunday school and the spiritual faith and teaching of our children and families. As we have done with our visioning process I would hope that over the next year we would commit ourselves to evaluating what we are doing and what we can do to meet the needs of this growing population. i.e. forming a committee to evaluate alternative ways, to do and times for Sunday School. Involving the parents and family in helping figure out what they want, will support and be a part of, and that by 2024 we have paid staff that can completely focus on building our children and family ministry.

I would like to find out what makes Sunday School something the young adults and families want to come. I would like Bible Studies that tie into issues that we face today. I also would like to see us do some kind of program for the k-5 group.

2 - C. Serving (outreach, stewardship, fellowship, community meal, using our gifts and talents, etc.)

A community outreach focus - that we as a congregation work to provide regular outreach ministries in which the congregation can use their gifts and talent for the betterment of God's Kingdom outside the ministry of the church.

i.e. regular mission trips, continuing activities that raise money/food/needed goods for others in our community, and we support not just with our money but our time and talent as well. Activities aimed at going and helping(spending time with) such organizations as the Boy's Farm, women's shelters, Oliver Gospel Mission...

I think we do excellent job within the church with activities. I would like to see us do outreach ministries and projects.

Expand community meal. Reach out more to the rest of the community. Go to other churches and invite them, post meal in public places. Help community understand it is for EVERYBODY not just the church. Don't think we have done a good job with that.

Really like the serving in the church, believe the most involvement and service we can provide for locally.
