Sunday, May 12, 2024

First Reading: Acts 1:1-11

1 In the first book, O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, ² until the day when he was taken up, after he had given commands through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. ³ He presented himself alive to them after his suffering by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God.

⁴ And while staying^[a] with them he ordered them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me; ⁵ for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with^[b] the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

⁶ So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷ He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." ⁹ And when he had said these things, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰ And while they were gazing into heaven as he went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, ¹¹ and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

Psalm 1

¹Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers;

²but his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night.

³He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers.

⁴The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away.

⁵Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous;

⁶for the Lord knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the wicked will perish.

Second Reading: 1 John 5:9-15

⁹If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of God is greater, for this is the testimony of God that he has borne concerning his Son. ¹⁰Whoever believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself. Whoever does not believe God has made him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning his Son. ¹¹And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹²Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. ¹³I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life. ¹⁴And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. ¹⁵And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.

Gospel: John 17:11b-19

11b [Jesus lifted up his eyes to heaven and said,] "Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. ¹²While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. ¹⁴I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁵I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth."

On this Seventh Sunday of Easter the scripture lessons focus on the task at hand for the newly formed church. The eleven disciples need to find a replacement for the one who betrayed Jesus. This will be the beginning of their apostolic ministry to the world. We are reminded of Jesus' prayer for his followers before his death; a prayer that asks for the protection of his closest friends as they go out into the world without him at their side. They will not be alone, however. They will soon have the Holy Spirit.

Carolinas Mission Region (CMR) 2024 Convocation Report

Congregations of the Carolinas Mission Region of the NALC gathered on Friday, May 3rd and Saturday, May 4th here at Holy Trinity for our annual convocation. Around 100 people attended the event, representing 38 congregations of the NALC in North and South Carolina. Pastor Randy and Kyle Page were voting delegates representing Holy Trinity.

Friday night's activities included mission presentations from groups including NALC Disaster Response, Lutheran Military Veterans & Family Ministries, Congo Mission International, and others. We enjoyed a delicious BBQ meal catered by Shealy's Barbeque.

Saturday's festivities included worship and Holy Communion, with Bishop Dan Selbo preaching. Our choir led a moving anthem, "We Are the Church", during the service, which also saw Rev. Dr. Nathan Yoder officially installed as the Director of Lutheran Studies at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary in Charlotte.

During the business sessions, the CMR budget and various motions were considered. A change to the CMR Constitution was discussed and ultimately tabled until next year's convocation. Elections were held for the Regional Council and the position of Dean for the South Carolina Mission District. Pastor Dawn Rister (St. Paul, Pomaria) was elected as Dean of the SC Mission District and will begin serving a three-year term.

Ordination and congregation anniversaries were also recognized. Convocation concluded with a Service of the Word and the installation of our new Regional Council.

SPECIAL THANKS to all those who served during the weekend's festivities – the convocation would not have been possible without you! Many of the guests and visitors were vocal about their appreciation of the warm welcome, generous hospitality, and helpfulness offered by our convocation team.
