5th Sunday after Pentecost

First Reading: Job 38:1-11

¹The LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind and said: ²"Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? ³Dress for action like a man; I will question you, and you make it known to me. ⁴Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. ⁵Who determined its measurements — surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? ⁶On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone, ⁷when the morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy? ⁸Or who shut in the sea with doors when it burst out from the womb, ⁹when I made clouds its garment and thick darkness its swaddling band, ¹¹ and prescribed limits for it and set bars and doors, ¹¹ and said, 'Thus far shall you come, and no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stayed'?"

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 6:1-13

¹Working together with {Christ}, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. ²For he says, "In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you." Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. ³We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; 7by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of

righteousness for the right hand and for the left; ⁸through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything. ¹¹We have spoken freely to you, Corinthians; our heart is wide open. ¹²You are not restricted by us, but you are restricted in your own affections. ¹³In return (I speak as to children) widen your hearts also.


Gospel: Mark 4:35-41

³⁵On that day, when evening had come, {Jesus} said to {the disciples}, "Let us go across to the other side." ³⁶And leaving the crowd, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. And other boats were with him. ³⁷And a great windstorm arose, and the waves were breaking into the boat, so that the boat was already filling. ³⁸But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion. And they woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" ³⁹And he awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. ⁴⁰He said to them, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" ⁴¹And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"

How often we fail to recognize the power of God in our lives. In today's Old Testament reading, God's voice pierced through the chaos of a whirlwind as he reminded Job of who is in control of all of life. The divine voice is echoed on the Sea of Galilee as Jesus calms an abrupt storm that sends waves crashing into the disciples' boat. "Peace! Be still," Jesus ordered the water, showing his power over creation.

Jesus' Plan for Making Disciples

Jesus tells to take up our cross and follow Him!

Fully committing to God as a disciple does not come without a cost.

To start with, God's kingdom must come first. His will must come first. If not, then you are not a disciple. When it comes down to issues of authority, priorities and decisions, Christ must be #1 when faced with any problems requiring careful thought, Christ must be asked first to reach those decisions. Discipleship demands a willingness to put God's rule first.

Jesus wants us to identify with Him such that if we are being accused of being a Christian, we say "I'm guilty." If we are accused of loving and following the Lord Jesus Christ, we accept the change! "You're right! I'm one of His!"

Being a disciple demands a commitment. It means placing God's rule over every area of your life allowing Him to govern every single word, choice, entertainment option, songs you listen to, your time, talents, and treasures! ALL of it! Are you there?

Now do you see why there are a lot of Christians but so few REAL disciples. Being a true disciple s full time, no holds barred commitment of everything that makes you who you are! It should not be done on a part time basis but that is what most of us do. It's that word Commitment!

It means saying No to your desires and plans for your life when they conflict with God's perfect will. It involves funneling all your decisions through His grid. There is no divisions between the sacred and the secular for a behavior. Everything is sacred because God bought your life with a price. He governs every single word.

Living as a disciple who visibly and verbally represents Christ requires that you relinquish all claims on every aspect of your life. Being a disciple costs! If you are a true disciple, Satan is coming after you! Satan is going to throw His army against you no matter what you do because we are in a war! Since that's true. You had better count the cost if you truly want to be ALL IN as a disciple!


June 29th will be here before we know it. For that reason, we are looking to sign up volunteers now to help that day
