FROM THE PASTOR

"Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." – 1 Corinthians 13:4–7

Dear Holy Trinity Family,

Paul calls us to the steadfast love of God – sacrificial love. This is a love that says, it's not about me; it's all about the object of my love. Jesus continued to love us even though we nailed Him to a cross. So, Paul goes on to write about a love that's defined by action: "Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful or proud or rude. It does not demand its own way..."

Love is NOT about how we feel; it's about how we act. You can't command an emotion. When Jesus says, "Love your enemies," He's not saying to feel warm and fuzzy feelings about your enemies. He's saying, treat your enemies well. Treat them better than they probably deserve.

When He tells us the greatest commandments are to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength – and to love your neighbor as yourself," He's talking about activity. He's talking about acting in a particular way because you love God. To love your neighbor means that you act in a particular way towards your neighbor. Same thing with your spouse, same thing with your children.


We love in a particular way because love is always attached to redemption. Hear that again: love is always attached to redemption. God loves us so that He redeems us – so that He restores our souls. Jesus was willing to bear all things, even the cross, for the sake of the redemption of the people that He loved.

Keep this in mind as we enter the season of Lent. Reflect on the ways you have loved, or failed to love, God and your neighbor. Repent of those places where your actions, or lack thereof, have been more selfish than selfless. And cling to the hope that because God has the power to change our hearts, our love may begin to look a little more like the unconditional love of Jesus with each passing day.

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Congregational Council Minutes January 14, 2024

The Holy Trinity Congregational Council met in regular session on Sunday, January 14, 2023 at 7:30am. Phillip Allison chaired the meeting and Allen Williams opened with devotions. Julie Haltiwanger will have devotions at the December meeting.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the following Congregational Council Minutes:

Pastor's Report

Pastor Drafts will be out of the office Dec. 25-Jan. 1 and Council will lead worship so that Kyle can continue to rest following his surgery. Council approved Dean and Barbie Rodgers' request to move their membership to Holy Trinity. Pastor gave an update on planning for the 2024 CMR Convocation. Good News Club will be held again this year at Little Mountain Elementary School on Wednesdays Feb. 14-Mar. 27 excluding Mar. 6. Volunteers, especially males, are needed and can contact Pastor or Carlotta Chapman. Installation of Council will be January 14, 2024. Pastor Drafts provided some information about some possible missionaries we could help. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to hold Scout Sunday on Feb. 4. We welcomed Anniston Lever into our church family through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. We mourn the death of Robert Wicker. New Council members Helen Koon, Bill Loadholdt, Danny Newton, and Bob Peters were installed. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to some and be seconded, and approved to accept the Pastor's Report.

Treasurer's Report Balances as of 12/1/23: General Fund - \$63,723.76 Building Maintenance - \$50,668.90 Reserve Fund CD - \$35,079.33 Thrivent-Derrick - \$97,565.53 Swittenburg-Monts - \$10,132.57 General Reserve CD 1 - \$50,000 General Reserve CD 2 - \$50,000

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report.

COUNCIL NOTES

Council Approved Open Items

- 1. It is a slow process to try to acquire the cemetery property but the committee is working on it.
- 2. The property committee is working to improve the outdoor lighting.

3. The property committee is also looking into the carpet on the front steps to see what would be best to replace it.

Unfinished Business

1. A motion was made, seconded, and approved for the Thanksgiving offering be given to support the Backpack Ministry.

2. Last year, Council approved to purchase a new manger scene, but it was noticed that the old one is out and some of the pieces are becoming very brittle.

New Business

A. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to give \$500 each to Pastor Drafts, Donna Fulmer, and Lib Boland and \$150 each for Ted Arnold, Brett Lindler, Marie Shealy, and Terecia Wilson for Christmas gifts.

B. The 2024 Benevolence Plan was discussed.

For NALC Denominational support: NALC home office increased to \$210,000.

For local ministries: Joy Mission Church is now self-sustaining and can be removed from local ministries. Backpack Ministries will be added for \$2,000. GAAP will be increased to \$2,000. Screaming Eagles will be added for \$500. Seminary support for Kyle Page will be added for \$2,000 (\$1,000 per semester). We will hold \$4,000 for local groups and citizens. Within this amount, we will hold \$1,000 for Immanuel Lutheran, Sumter and Pastor Drafts will reach out to them to see if they need it. This will bring the local ministries total to \$18,000.

For distant ministries: Water Missions will be increased to \$2,500. Lutheran World Relief will be removed. Support to a missionary will be added for \$3,000.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept this 2024 Benevolence Plan.

C. An assistant treasurer is needed if anyone knows of someone.

D. One of the cleaning teams could use a little more help. A plea will be made to see if we can recruit more volunteers. Council Liaisons still need to be added. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the 2024 Congregational Committees.

E. All Committee and Congregational Appreciation Sunday on Jan. 7, 2024. Tina Attaway has volunteered to cook spaghetti. Council will provide desserts and clean up.

F. Joe Boland was elected President of the Council.Carter Lake was elected as Vice-President. Cindy Frick was elected as Secretary.

G. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to give Shelley and Kyle Page \$2,000 to help with Kyle's current medical expenses.

Committee Reports Business continues as usual for many committees.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned with The Lord's Prayer.
