

Dear Holy Trinity Family,

Cartographers in the ancient world would often get to the end of what they knew and just start drawing pictures - dragons, sea monsters, and all kinds of things. The meaning was plain: this is unknown territory; there are dangerous waters and monsters and terrors out there in the world.

A general happened to be marching into one of these unknown territories pursuing a foe. He sent orders to his commanding officer, saying, "I need new orders because I've walked off the map." Have you ever felt like you walked off the map? Like you're in unknown territory? As a new year begins, maybe that's exactly how you feel. In some ways, every new year is unchartered territory. We don't know what situations may arise or what circumstances we may endure.

So as our calendars turn to 2024, I think it is a good time to reflect on the 23rd Psalm. It has a lot to teach us about what to do when we are in unknown territory or have walked off the map. We need a guide, and no one could be better than the Good Shepherd. No matter how strong or vast our enemies appear to be, not one of them stands a chance against Him.

It might be a good practice for you to wake up to the Shepherd's Psalm over these coming weeks. You will begin to know that despite the unknown, unchartered territory, the Good Shepherd is always beside you.
