From the Pastor

"For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'" – Ephesians 5:13-14

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This month we celebrate the 4th of July, our Independence Day as citizens of the United States of America. My hope for you is that you will take time to contemplate what it means to be free – both as a citizen of the United States and as a follower of Jesus Christ.

Paul's text above reminds us that – as Christians – we are free, but not free from responsibility. In fact, the opposite is true: with freedom comes great responsibility – the responsibility to use our freedom in service to God and for His good purpose.

We become free by putting our faith in Christ, by becoming part of His body, by confessing His way is the way of truth and the way of life. So, if we are free from having to do good works in order to be saved, the question then becomes: why should I bother doing good works at all? Why should I bother trying to produce the fruit of the Spirit?

Well, Martin Luther in a rare moment of being succinct, said it this way: "Good works do not make a good man, but a good man does good works." Jesus Himself said, "...a good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit; neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit."

In other words, when we embrace our faith, when we truly live our lives in the reality of what Christ has done for us, then we will live our lives in line with the Spirit and the Spirit will naturally produce the fruit.

Luther later writes, "So I will give myself as a sort of little Christ to my neighbor. Christ has given Himself to me, and I will do nothing in this life except what I see is needful, advantageous, and wholesome for my neighbor."

So the question we must now ask ourselves is this: how will we use our freedom today? Will we use it well, or will we use it selfishly?

Something for you to think about.

Council Minutes

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Congregational Council Minutes May 19, 2024 Meeting

The Holy Trinity Congregational Council met in regular session on Sunday, May 19, 2024 at 7:30am. Carter Lake chaired the meeting and Danny Newton opened with devotions. Helen Koon will have devotions at the June meeting.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the April 14, 2024 Congregational Council Minutes after amended and the April 21, 2024 Called Congregational Meeting Minutes.

Pastor's Report

The pastor will be on vacation August 5-11, October 14-20 and December 25, 2024-- January 1, 2025. There were 2 Baptisms—Emma Duvall and Mirin Hayes

The area NALC Youth groups met April 28,2024 at St. Peters. It was a huge success. Our youth won the PB&J collection. Hopefully this area youth meeting can be a quarterly gathering.

Motion made, seconded, and approved for Peyton Koon to join HT.

2024 CMR Convocation on May 3 -4, 2024 held at HTLC was a huge success. Many thanks to everyone who helped with this event.

Blair Cromer, Cooper Morales, and Eli Kednocker to be presented for Confirmation today , Sunday, May 19, 2024. Graduates will be recognized as well.

Pastor will be working with Ted Arnold to start another Life group for widows and widowers called "Surviving Spouses."

Some upcoming events- Day camp Counselor Orientation June 2-7(HTLC hosting counselors), June 9-14 Day Camp; Vacation Bible School June 17-21.

The Committee Mailboxes are in the process of being updated outside of the church office for our committees and executive team. Continue to leave mail at the church office for now.

Bob Dernbach coordinates kit builds for NALC disaster relief. He would like for HTLC to sponsor a "kit build" day on Saturday, October 12, 2024 to also include area NALC congregations. This event will last about 3 hours and would include worship and conclude with lunch. Council is in agreement in sponsoring this event and Pastor will get back with Mr. Dernbach for further logistics to be discussed later as far as funding and supplies. Would be possibly around 75-100 people.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Pastor's Report.

- At the April meeting there was discussion on 2 payments that were noted under Workman's Compensation. This is generally a 1 time premium. Spyros has contacted Catherine for further specifics of these charges and she will get back to him later.

Council Minutes

-There was discussion also regarding the Preschool monies and current way of covering expenses . It was noted that there is some lag time with the church getting reimbursed from pre-school. A motion was made, seconded, and approved for the preschool payroll taxes to come directly out of the preschool account and not from the church's general fund.

-Also, Sheri will get with Ann Sanders regarding the lag time of reimbursements from the preschool to the church's general fund. Sheri will report back to council next meeting.

-Stewardship and Finance Committee has recommended that the pastor have a credit card. Spyros has been working on this for several weeks. Discussion also involved getting Marie a card as well. She has declined this idea but there was also discussion about a credit card which could be used as needed and kept in the safe. Was decided to move forward with the pastor's credit card and Pastor will discuss with Marie what she would prefer and get back with council.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report.

Council Approved Open Items

1. Danny Newton has been working on the church cemetery property acquisition. This is now resolved. The trees need to be planted but otherwise all resolved. The original documents are signed and will be placed in the safe deposit box. Copies of these have been made and will be attached to the April Meeting minutes. Also Carter's friend will probably donate the trees that will be planted. The attorney fees were \$1000.00.

2. The property committee continues looking at the possibility of adding a railing at the bottom step of the balcony and has contacted David Bush who is currently evaluating this area.

Unfinished Business

1. What to do with the church bus was again discussed. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to have the property committee pursue the sale of the church bus. It was also discussed that a sub-committee of Bart Chapman, Andrew Frick, Kevin Shealy and Daniel Curtis could further investigate all the logistics of how to accomplish this. They will report back to council.

2. Carter reported that the Director of Youth and Education Ministries job position will likely be posted this week. 3. Pew Cushions–Previous information for cost of pew cushions in balcony and in sanctuary was \$39,600.00 possibly less. A cushion was ordered and placed in the sanctuary as an example for Council to evaluate. Bob presented updated information with the cushions now costing approximately \$55,568.00. Discussion followed and was decided to table the pew cushions for now, but to further investigate repairing/refurbishing the pews themselves.

4. Gift for Cemetery–Ann Sanders presented to Council at the April meeting a proposal to place a stone archway to the entrance of the cemetery with a monetary donation of \$10,000.00 which was given to the church by Ann and Audrey's mom and dad. Sheri reported that Ann and Audrey met with the Cemetery Committee and are still working on all the details for this project.

Council Minutes

1. Parking lot ministry. It was reported last meeting that their were handicapped individuals who were having difficulties accessing the church and Sunday School. A parking lot ministry was discussed and need for prices of golf carts. Cindy reported that the golf carts at Custom Golf Carts Columbia in Chapin would run about \$4500.00 for a 4 seater and \$7500.00 for a 6 seater battery operated golf cart. Further discussion followed and was decided that a parking lot ministry team needs to be developed to further pursue this area. Phil and Helen would be interested in being on this team. Cindy will discuss with Worship and Music Committee.

2. Tree removal. Bob Peters reported on cost estimates for removal of the large tree by the parking lot and stump grinding and cut/remove other surrounding trees of the cemetery to be approximately \$12,000.00.After much discussion, a motion was made, seconded, and approved to have Alpha Tree Service trim/remove the large tree by the parking lot and grind the stumps and cut/remove other trees around the cemetery not to exceed \$12,000.00. 3. Need for assistant treasurer. Still looking for this position.

4. TLC use. It had been brought to council's attention that perhaps the TLC was not being utilized properly especially when it comes to outside use other than the congregation. Julie Haltiwanger reported the TLC committee has met and are currently working on the guidelines and will continue to report back to council with recommendations.

New Business

A. Envelopes in the pockets behind the pews are missing. Sheri reported that they need to be ordered and she will get with Marie to re-order these.

Committee Reports

Christian Education – Meeting today to discuss posting the recently approved Director of Youth and Education Ministry. Previously discussed to have an activity bag for children- working on this. Spyros has added Sunday school offering donations to the budget list

Property – Discussed in minutes. Gutter guards have been installed. Floor where wine is poured is sagging and will need repair. TLC issue of water leaking has been resolved. Outside stairs have been carpeted.

Preschool –May 9, 2024 was the end of school year celebration and a huge turn out.

Social Ministry –Golden Age Sunday was held April 28 and quite successful. Thanks to all who helped.

Stewardship/Finance – The committee still needs an assistant treasurer. The first quarter ministry plan review was performed and overall looked good- Sunday School, church grounds, bus insurance, and workmen's compensation have been noted to have valid increases. The general Fund is ahead of budget with \$121,659.74 brought in with \$84,896.76 needed. Building fund has brought in \$26,939.00. This committee will meet with preschool committee to follow up on some items. Reviewed the Auditing committee's report with everything in order. Quick books is in the process of being migrated from the old church computer to the newer one which will allow remote access to Quick Books. James is reviewing the church insurance policy with Carter. This committee recommends Pastor be issued a credit card-please see further discussion under treasurers report. Worship and Music – Brett Lindler continues to do a good job as Director of Music Ministry

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned with The Lord's Prayer.
