From the Pastor

“When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.”– Acts 2:1-4

Dear Holy Trinity Family,

I'm sure you are familiar with the Tower of Babel account in Genesis 11. God thwarted the plans of the sinful people to build a tower to heaven, confused their language, and scattered them across the face of the earth.

This month we celebrate the Day of Pentecost, the time when the confusion of the language was lifted so people could finally hear the Good News. And what is that Good News?

As Peter will go on to explain, the gap between God and us has finally been breached – not by building a building; not by building a tower; not with bricks and mortar; but with a cross. The way to heaven has been found, but it is NOT something you can build.

It's a person that we embrace, and His name is Jesus. This is what we celebrate every time we gather together, that Jesus has done for us what we couldn't do on our own. He has removed the sin which created the gap between us and heaven. But on Pentecost, we also remember that the God who did extraordinary things through ordinary people is still working with us today because Jesus is alive, and His Spirit is with us now.

All of the things that happened then are still happening now. That ingathering of people and the pouring out of the Spirit on the Day of Pentecost hasn't stopped. The Holy Spirit is still gathering people in today. The Holy Spirit who spoke through His disciples 2,000 years ago is still speaking through His disciples today.

The Holy Spirit who sent those early followers into the world is still sending us into the world today so that we, as they did, can point to the cross and tell the people that we meet, “Quit trying to build your way into heaven. There is your hope. There is your confidence. There is your peace. There is the way to heaven. There is the truth of God and life everlasting.”

Something for you to think about as Pentecost approaches.

Disciple Discipleship Disciple-making

What is a disciple?

Jesus' Plan for Making Disciples

Our previous discussion focused on the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) with Jesus commanding us to “Make Disciples.” Three participles were used to explain how this command was to be followed – 1) Going 2) Baptizing and 3) Teaching. Let’s look at these closer.

1. Going

Go to people, Jesus expects us to “go out.” We are expected to “go out” and reach others who know nothing or very little about Jesus. Christians are not doing the work of the church if we are not winning souls to Christ or witnessing to the to the message of the gospels.

If the church is to grow by making disciples, its people must be willing to reach out into the world/community or local areas as Christ’s witnesses. That is why Jesus sent us the Holy Spirit. “You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses” (Acts 1:87). The Holy Spirit whose fruit includes love and peace (Galatians 5:22) will give you boldness and opportunity to speak on His behalf.

Evangelism can be defined as sharing the good news of Christ’s substitutionary death and resurrection and His free offer of forgiveness for sin and eternal life to all who come to Him by faith to receive it. The church should encourage and equip believers to effectively share their faith with unbelievers as well as believers!

2) Baptizing

Helping people identify with Christ.

Jesus said that part of making disciples was baptizing those to whom we have gone and who have accepted Christ. He was not saying to simply get people wet! The primary meaning of the Greek work baptism is “identification”!

When we put our trust in Christ, we become so completely identified with Him that His death and resurrection to new life become our death and resurrection. Many Christians struggle in their daily lives because they don’t understand their new ID. They don’t realize that being “in Christ” is such a radically new way of life that whatever happens to Christ happens to US.

3) Teaching

Teach people Biblical truth.

Once people have believed the gospel and have been ID with Christ, we must teach them “to observe all that I commanded you” (Matthew 28:20). Jesus said the goal is that people “observe,” or obey, all that He commanded us. Unfortunately, many Christians want to audit the Christian life. They want the information without incurring any course responsibility. Thus accountability must be a key component of our instruction since obedience is the goal.

The goal of biblical teaching to combine information and knowledge with skill in applying the truth to daily life. Making disciples is a process of spiritual development. God wants to take the negatives in our lives and turn them into positives so that we come out looking like His Son.

Many people will say they don’t know enough scripture to teach others. In general, your actions can speak louder than words. If the “seed” or “idea” is planted, God will cultivate and do the rest.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Christian Education Committee has been prayerfully discerning how our congregation may provide formation and growth in the Christian faith for parishioners of all ages. We understand, in particular, the changes and challenges facing our children and youth today. To that end, we have researched, consulted with, and educated ourselves on what is being done across the NALC, the Carolinas Mission Region, and in local churches here in the midlands. The process has been extensive but nonetheless rewarding; it has revealed to us the importance of having a full-time, dedicated person lead the educational ministry of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church.

Congregations with thriving children's, youth, and adult ministries have invested in a staff position like the one we are now proposing. We are calling this position the "Director of Youth and Education Ministries", highlighting - first and foremost - that this will be a ministry of our congregation. Second, this person will have an active role in the lives of our children and youth, helping to "train up a child in the way he should go" so that "even when he is old he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6). Third, this position will seek ways to foster educational opportunities for every age in our church.

We invite you to prayerfully discern God's will for us by reading over the attached position description and criteria for the Director of Youth and Education Ministries. We will hold an informational meeting on Sunday, April 14th, followed by a second meeting and congregational vote on formally creating this position on Sunday, April 21st. Your presence at both meetings is welcomed and appreciated.

Responsibilities

Sunday School

- Seek ways to foster innovative programs in Sunday School through Bible-based curriculum and other resources
- Oversee the recruitment, training, and support of Sunday School teachers
- Work to provide a quality Sunday School experience for preschool, K-12 youth, and adult students
- Evaluate, develop, and implement a class for high school graduates, college students, and other young adults
- Encourage the growth of the “Living in Faith” Sunday School class
- Communicate with the congregation through the Bulletin, Herald, Website, and other means as appropriate
- Attend and facilitate Christian Education Committee meetings
- Observe and have working knowledge of all facets of the educational ministry of Holy Trinity

Holy Trinity Youth (Teens for Christ)

- Evaluate, develop, and implement a quality program commensurate with the needs of the youth of Holy Trinity so that they grow to “Preach, Teach, and Serve in Christ’s Name”
- Plan and prepare curriculum for youth meetings
- Communicate a calendar of events with the church office and congregation
- Organize an advisory group of parents to help with long range planning, projects, and serve as advisors and chaperones
- Be available to the youth to provide counseling and guidance when needed
- Encourage participation in Mission Region and NALC church-wide youth gatherings and retreats

Plan, organize, promote, facilitate, and evaluate the following events:

Council Minutes

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church
Congregational Council Minutes
February 11, 2024

The Holy Trinity Congregational Council met in regular session on Sunday, January 14, 2024 at 7:30am. Joe Boland chaired the meeting and Julie Haltiwanger opened with devotions. Sheri Wicker will have devotions at the February meeting.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the December 10, 2023 Congregational Council Minutes as corrected.

Pastor's Report

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the membership request of the Zwart family (J.P., Mary Jane, Kayleigh Jane, Keribeth, and Jase). Scott and Cheri Bell will officially join our church family on Sunday, January 28 and Dean and Barbie Rodgers will officially join on February 25. There was discussion about the need for a new pictorial directory. Pastor Drafts needs some volunteers for the 2024 CMR Convocation on May 3 and 4. Good News Club volunteers will have an organizational meeting on Jan. 16, then GNC will be held at Little Mountain Elementary starting on Feb. 14. Council installation is today during the worship service. Scout Sunday will be Feb. 4. The youth will host the annual Souper Bowl luncheon on Feb. 11. Ash Wednesday services will be held on Feb. 14 at 10am and 7pm. Following Council's discussion about benevolence for 2024, Pastor updated everyone that Immanuel Lutheran is still in need of and appreciative of our financial support. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Pastor's Report.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report.

Council Approved Open Items

1. Danny Newton agreed to take over the work Charles Everett Frick was doing to acquire the property in front of the cemetery.
2. The property committee is looking at adding a railing at the bottom step of the balcony.
3. The outdoor lighting has greatly improved, and the property committee is continuing to look at the area between the buildings.
4. Plans are made to replace the carpet in the parish building.
5. The property committee is looking into replacing the carpet on the front steps to see what would be best to replace it. It was noted that there are screws missing on the threshold of the door.

Unfinished Business

1. Daniel Curtis is working to determine the value of the church bus to see if we want to sell it.
2. The company did not receive the t-shirt order before Christmas and it had to be resubmitted.

New Business

- A. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to use the 4:00 Christmas Eve offering to purchase a new nativity scene. Bill Loadholdt will look for a new nativity scene.
- B. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to rollover the Swittenburg-Monts CD. We will be buying about 14 chairs.
- C. The Cemetery Committee recommended approval of cemetery treasury officers and prices for 2024 cemetery squares. A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the following recommendations:
- a. Billy Caldwell, Assistant Treasurer of Cemetery Committee
 - b. Sheri Wicker, Treasurer of Cemetery Committee
 - c. 9 x 9 Square
Price for Members of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church is \$250 whereby \$200 is designated for maintenance and \$50 designated for perpetual care.
Price for Non-members = \$1,250 (five times the price for members) whereby \$1,225 is designated for maintenance and \$25 is designated for perpetual care.
 - d. 5 x 5 Square
Price for Members of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church is \$175.00 whereby \$150 is designated for maintenance and \$25 is designated for perpetual care.
Price for Non-members is \$875 (five times the price for members) whereby \$850 is designated for maintenance and \$25 is designated for perpetual care.

D. There has been a request for the church to get pew cushions. The property committee will get a group together to look at the possibilities and options available.

Committee Reports

Christian Education - The committee has a strong desire to provide meaningful opportunities for our youth, but this is extremely difficult when leadership is based on volunteer members who are working and have so many other commitments. The committee is requesting that we consider creating a position for someone to be dedicated to our young people. Pastor Drafts will talk with Melanie Corn to develop a job description and see what ideas she may be able to offer.

Property - The committee has suggested that we look at adding a vapor barrier at the parsonage.

Preschool - no report

Social Ministry - The committee has identified different events and contacts for them. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to hold Golden Age Sunday on April 28.

Stewardship/Finance - The committee still needs an assistant treasurer. They will be meeting on February 1 to review last year's report.

Worship and Music - no report.

Additionally, it was noted that we may need to ask Carter to check about liability insurance on the playground.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned with The Lord's Prayer.

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church
Special Called Congregational Meeting
February 11, 2024

A special called Congregational Meeting was held on January 28, 2024 after the Worship Service. Joe Boland, President, presided over the meeting. Frank Lake and Marty Frick were in attendance to share additional information about the flooring project. While the carpet was being taken up, the workers ran into some issues which required the expertise and assistance of ENH Solutions, as recommended by Steve Bush. After consideration by Council of the information presented by Maxton King, Frank Lake, and Marty Frick, a motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the abatement of the flooring issues from ENH Solutions not to exceed \$14,000 and an estimate of \$2,500 for air quality monitoring from ABS Environmental to be paid from the Building Fund. Spyros Lezimis, Treasurer, announced that an anonymous donor has pledged up to \$17,000 to cover the cost of this work.
