From the Pastor

"So Paul, standing in the midst of the Areopagus, said: 'Men of Athens, I perceive that in every way you are very religious. For as I passed along and observed the objects of your worship, I found also an altar with this inscription: To the unknown god. What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you.'" – Acts 17:22-23

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The people of Athens had hundreds and hundreds of shrines, altars, and temples to every kind of god imaginable. They were so sure there was a god out there, but they weren't sure who it was – so they even made one to an unknown God. It is obvious to Paul that they are searching for something.

It would be easy for us to say that this context was long ago and that we don't worship idols, but the fact is, we have lots of idols. Martin Luther, in his Large Catechism, puts things into perspective: "Now, I say that whatever you set your heart on and put your trust in is truly your god."

If you put your faith and trust in science to fix the world's problems, then science is your god. If you put your faith and trust in money to get you through every trial and tribulation, then money has become your god. If you put your faith and trust in a political system, then that system has become your god.

The passage that immediately follows today's reading says this: "When they heard Paul speak about the resurrection of the dead, some laughed in contempt, but others said, 'We want to hear more about this later.' That ended Paul's discussion with them, but some joined him and became believers."

Some mocked him, others wanted to hear more, and still others became followers, which is how it usually works when we share our faith with other people. And that is okay because the primary attribute of witnessing is faith, not success. We plant the seed with the knowledge that only God can make the seed grow.

May Paul's witness to the men of Athens inspire you to share your faith with someone else. And like him, may you do it in a way that is respectful, considerate, and loving.

Council Minutes

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Congregational Council Minutes June 9, 2024 Meeting

The Holy Trinity Congregational Council met in regular session on Sunday, June 9, 2024 at 7:30am. Joe Boland chaired the meeting and Helen Koon opened with devotions. Joe Boland will have devotions at the July meeting.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the May 19, 2024 Congregational Council Minutes.

Pastor's Report

The pastor will be on vacation August 5-11, October 14-20 and December 25, 2024-- January 1, 2025. Peyton Koon will join on June 30th.

The "Surviving Spouses" life group interest meeting will be held on June 25th.

The room beside Brett's office may be a good space for the Director of Youth & Education Ministries.

We can probably shift to quarterly rodent services with First Choice Pest Control. They do provide a rodent and pest package for \$300/quarter if we are interested. Terminix is currently doing our pest control. First Choice's rodent control is \$125/quarter.

Some upcoming events- Day camp is June 9-14 with kickoff today. HTLC is hosting the counselors and their training was last week; Vacation Bible School - June 17-21; August 9 - NALC Online Mission Convocation (6-9 pm).

The NALC Disaster Kit Build date may change to Oct. 12 due to Mayer Memorial's 125th anniversary celebration. Bob Dernbach will let Pastor Randy know for sure.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Pastor's Report.

Council Minutes

Treasurer's Report

- -Spyros renewed the 3 CDs last month for 5% interest to be re-evaluated in 6 months.
- Katherine believes we need to keep paying payroll taxes for the preschool out of the General Fund and let them reimburse the church to avoid being audited.
- Sheri talked with Marie about how things are reimbursed, and they think everything is up to date. She also talked to Mrs. Ann who will audit their books at the end of June. Sheri agrees with Katherine's recommendation to leave things like they are. Sheri will recommend to Preschool that they hire a payroll service. Preschool employees should not ask Katherine for tax consulting. Sheri also asked Marie to order the special offering envelopes that go in the pews.
- The parsonage utilities for May were approximately 3 times the regular amount. There was some work done (water heater was pulled / has tankless system now), so it probably was double billed, but Spyros will look more closely at that.
- Donations given to the Community Meal will go back to the General Fund with a designation for Social Ministry.
- QuickBooks is on an old computer and the operating system was constantly throwing flags. James and Spyros were going to try to put QuickBooks on a new computer. It is a 2019 version of QuickBooks and the Windows operating system has not been updated. Bill and Jake Loadholdt, Phillip Armstrong, Spyros Lezimis, and James Wieters will work with Lee Attaway to evaluate the computer system to see what needs to be done to get QuickBooks working like it needs to be.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report.

Council Approved Open Items

1. The property committee continues to look at the possibility of adding a railing at the bottom step of the balcony and has contacted David Bush who is currently evaluating this area. The plaster next to the brick is not a good anchor point and it keeps falling apart, so David will try to look at anchoring it on the other side considering it is a narrow step. May be possible to anchor it into the window casing.

2. Cameron Kaihara is putting together a list of companies that refurbish pews. Once pews are repaired, we can revisit the idea of getting pew cushions.



Unfinished Business

1.A team has been put together to work on selling the church bus. Marie is looking for the title of the bus.

2.One resume has been submitted for the Director of Youth and Education Ministries position and one person in the congregation is prayerfully considering it. Carter asked that everyone share the job announcement.

3.Gift for Cemetery—Mrs. Ann will be getting with the steel company about making the archway. David Bush has

3.Gift for Cemetery—Mrs. Ann will be getting with the steel company about making the archway. David Bush has put stakes in the ground to mark off where it will go.

4.Parking lot ministry. Music and Worship met and recognized that there is a small group of people who physically can't get to Sunday School and worship so they have to decide to do one or the other. The handicap spots are on an incline so they're not very helpful. A team of 5 people are looking at options. Having a golf cart poses its own set of problems including needing electricity wherever it is stored and making sure there are people to drive it every week, rain or shine. Another consideration is to add handicap parking in front of the church, approximately from the front steps to the parking lot. A golf cart would be beneficial during funerals to help people get to the cemetery. Some people may bring their personal golf carts to use for a few months as a test run to see how much this service would be used. May just ask people to leave the front open for people who have physical limitations and need to park close to be able to attend worship. The space on the street between the upper and lower parking lots may need to be marked as "no parking". Maxton will provide updates to Council.

5.It will probably be July before the tree work is done.

6.We still need an assistant treasurer. James and Spyros each have someone to speak with about it. 7.The TLC committee is working on revising the guidelines and will continue to report back to Council with recommendations.

New Business

A.Fresh Eyes follow-up of committees – In the grand scheme of things, the new organization of committees is working. The committee that has formed to discuss selling the bus and the team that is looking at the Parking Lot Ministry are two great examples of how a group of people will come together when an issue comes up, address the issue, then disband. There is concern that there should be a cemetery committee. The cemetery is its own entity and should at least be represented on the property committee. Overlooking that when the committees were reorganized is a bump that was bound to happen. Now, we need to look at how it all is working and what we may need to change. When each committee meets in the upcoming months, a member from Fresh Eyes should be invited to attend and discuss how things are going and get recommendations for changes.

The Cemetery Committee will be a subcommittee of the Property Committee.

Committee Reports

Christian Education – Will be working on activity bags for children. For Vacation Bible School last year, \$1,128 was spent on food and Tina thinks she will need \$1,500 this year. The line item budget for VBS is \$2,000. There is a concern that only \$500 will remain for decorations, supplies, crafts, etc. Can the line item be increased to \$3,000 next year? Is there \$850 somewhere that can be put in the budget for this year? A motion was made, seconded, and approved for up to \$1,000 over the current budget be used for Vacation Bible School.Receipts will be given to Marie.Sheri Wicker will be teaching an adult class for parents of the children attending VBS and other young adults. An older adult class is also being offered.

Property – A motion was made, seconded, and approved for the Cemetery Committee to consist of Ted Arnold, Charles Frick, Billy Caldwell, Marty Frick, Curtis Hardy, Kelvin Chapman, Robbie Wicker, and Sheri Wicker. James Sligh will be invited to join as well. In January, these officers were approved: Billy Caldwell – assistant treasurer, Sheri Wicker – treasurer, and Charles Frick – Business Manager.

- -There might be some electrical issues because some LED lights on the exterior of the building are burning out quicker than they should. Frank and Larry will be bringing in some electricians to look at it. There is a soft spot in the floor where communion is prepared. Marty and Darin are looking at this.
- There is a ceiling light in the sanctuary flickering, but we may not have a ladder tall enough to reach it.
- There are 2 dead shrubs at the parsonage. Frank and Maxton will remove them.
- There is a stained ceiling in the front living room from water damage when the new roof had to be put on. Frank and Maxton will repair it and completely repaint the room.
- At the parsonage, there is a bare spot in the yard where the two roads meet that has started to erode. Maxton asked for the committee to look at it.
- Bill and Cameron will be pressure washing the fence at the parsonage.
- The next property committee meeting is in August.

Preschool -

Social Ministry - Volunteers are needed at GAAP for June 29. Three people have signed up, but 5 are needed.

-Community meal is coming up.

Stewardship/Finance -

Worship and Music – There have been problems with streaming the service. Some parts have been bad and have been replaced, so hopefully the issue is resolved.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned with The Lord's Prayer.
