Dear Brothers and Sisters,

So, we must ask ourselves: are we ready to go anywhere God calls us? And are we ready and willing to do those things which He calls us to do?

Council Minutes

Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Congregational Council Minutes August 11, 2024 Meeting

The Holy Trinity Congregational Council met in regular session on Sunday, August 11, 2024 at 7:30am. Joe Boland chaired the meeting and Carter Lake opened with devotions. Bill Loadholt will have devotions at the September meeting.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the July 14, 2024 Congregational Council Minutes.

Pastor's Report

-The pastor will be on vacation October 14-20 and December 25, 2024-- January 1, 2025.

-Office for Director of Youth & Education Ministries-- please continue to think about this space.Room by Brett's office may be a possibility.

-Last council meeting Pastor reported Tina Attaway would like to restart a Sunday School class for pre-school age children (2-4 years old). She will work to get the parents involved in teaching the classes and be a resource after the class gets started. Council agreed to go forward and Pastor will get back with Tina.

-First Choice Pest Control-see minutes

-Some upcoming events-August 9 - NALC Online Mission Convocation (6-9 pm), Sunday August 18-Acolyte training (9:15 AM); Sunday September - Stewardship Sunday (Time and talent forms made available); Sundays, September 22,29, and October 6- First Communion classes- 9:15 am; Sunday, October 6-First Communion Sunday; October 27- Start of Confirmation classes.

-The NALC Disaster Kit Build date is Oct. 12 .Bob Dernbach has challenged HTLC and participating churches to build 150 flood buckets. We will also be collecting Bibles, quilts, and gift cards.

-A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Pastor's Report.

Council Minutes

-The tree removal/trimmingof the cemetery and tree across from playground is completed. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to split the tree cutting expenses 50% to the cemetery fund and 50% to the General fund.

-Under Benevolence, our support organizations showed no monies had been paid out yet. Normally half of the monies to these groups are paid out the first 6 months and the remainder of monies the last part of the year. This has now been caught up and will be reflected in next month's budget report.

-Issue of finding an assistant treasurer is still a problem which Spyros and James have been diligently working on-please see minutes under unfinished business.

-Income activity was noted to be down slightly for several months but as far as YTD funding, we need to be at 58% funding and we are currently at 62% funding.

-Ann Sanders, Auditor, provided a comprehensive audit report which was distributed. Overall, the report was very favorable. The benevolence issue has been addressed. The reimbursement for convocation was posted under retreats and conferences and will be corrected. The deposit for community meal should have been posted to Social Ministry Account. Sunday school and Vacation Bible School have gone over budget. There were some questions noted on Teens for Christ financial report. Pastor, Joe Boland, and Cindy Frick will meet with the Youth advisor, to review budget and answer any questions as well as obtain feedback.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report.

Council Approved Open Items

1.Railing at bottom step of balcony. This is currently an on-going process. The property committee continues to look at the possibility of adding a railing at the bottom step of the balcony and has contacted David Bush who is currently evaluating this area. The committee will be meeting on the 20th.

2.Repair/refurbish pews. This is currently ongoing. Cameron Kaihara and Marty Frick have gotten estimates from 3 different vendors and will possibly have several different options that council may choose from.Once pews are repaired, we can revisit the idea of getting pew cushions.

Unfinished Business

1. Director of Youth and Education Ministries position—Carter Lake reported 2 resumes have been submitted and these candidates have been interviewed by Christian Education. Further discussion followed regarding this position and it was felt that perhaps other options need to be explored at this time before making any final decisions. These options include the possibility of this being made a part-time position; exploring different insurance options like group policy/etc; and possibility of making this an associate pastor position. Christian Education will meet back to explore these and other options and report back to Council.

2. Gift for Cemetery-Nothing new for now. The rock columns have been done and look beautiful. Mrs. Ann Sanders was contacting the steel company for the archway.

3. Parking lot ministry. It has been recognized that there is a small group of people who physically can't get to Sunday School and worship so they have to decide to do one or the other. Music and Worship appointed a team of 5 people to look at options. Helen Koon reported that the team had met and discussed different options for the golf cart. They will be getting back with Music and Worship. Helen will continue to provide updates to Council.

4. Need for assistant treasurer. Spyros and James have been trying to find someone for months. Spyros reminded everyone that Catherine won't be doing payroll after this year. Also there is a question of how much longer Marie may be doing payroll for preschool. Spyros and James have been looking to buy a new software package for QuickBooks. Apparently the package needed that is being advertised is no longer being sold. After much discussion, a suggestion was made that we may need to hire an outside accounting firm. This would solve a lot of issues as far as would no longer need a treasurer, would make auditing easier, and payroll would be taken care of through it. It was decided to have Stewardship Finance committee make recommendations and report back to council. Tony Shell will oversee this.

5. The TLC committee is working on revising the guidelines and will continue to report back to Council with recommendations. Julie Haltiwanger will be meeting with the Cub Scout Leaders to review the use of the TLC.

6. Fresh Eyes Follow-up of Committees. All committees have been asked to meet before the end of August to determine overall how things are working and what if any changes of any committees need to be made. A member of Fresh Eyes will be invited to attend each committee meeting to evaluate how things are going on each committee and need for recommendations if any. This information will be gathered end of this month so that recommendations can be made for the coming year. Cemetery was brought up again. The Constitution By-Law of the church states "that the management of the cemetery shall be in the hands of a committee known as the Cemetery Committee elected yearly by the Congregational Council at its January Meeting." The Cemetery Committee will need to be a standing committee by itself and this will be further discussed by Fresh Eyes.

7. First Choice for Rodent and Pest Control. First Choice is currently doing our rodent control. They also offer pest control. Terminix is currently doing our pest control. Bob Peters reported that 2 Terminix Companies are treating our facilities. One company treats termites all facilities and pest control of the parsonage. The other Terminix treats pests in the parish/church/ TLC (This Terminix Co. would not return his call). The Terminix he was able to contact is the termites all facilities and pest control of parsonage stated the Pest control we currently have covered mice and rodents for all facilities . If there are problems noted between treatments, then Terminix should be notified. Pest Control for all facilities would be \$334.00 per quarter for Terminix/ \$385.00 per quarter for First Choice. For Termite bond, First Choice - \$1100.00 per year with initial cost of \$6600.00; Terminix is \$823.00 yearly. Currently, we are double paying parsonage pest control. Property Committee will find out what kind of agreement we currently have with First Choice and continue to try to contact the other Terminix and then go forward and report back to Council further recommendations.

8. Chartering request from Cub Scout Pack 111. Cub Scout Pack 111 has asked if HTC would consider being their chartering organization moving forward. They are currently chartered by Little Mountain Ruritan club. We will plan to meet with the Cub Scout Leaders for additional information before going forward. Storage for scouts was discussed and suggestions made. This topic will be further discussed at a later meeting.

9. Danny Newton reported that the trees were finally planted at the bank along the cemetery. Tony Shell had been keeping them watered; Charles Frick dug the holes, and Danny assisted in planting them. The landowners who requested the trees initially were asking for the church to purchase 1 more tree but this was not in the initial proposal and could not be approved. They may purchase one on their own if desired.

Council Minutes

New Business

A. Contractorbylaw.

Based on recommendations from Stewardship Finance, a preliminary contractor bylaw for contractor repairs was presented by Phillip Allison . This bylaw included the following-- no single member of HTLC should be able to commit the church to billable contracted repair or construction without approval of the relevant committee chair and the council liaison; if there is an emergency then the pastor could give approval; and the contractor will have to provide proof of Liability insurance and Workman's Compensation.A monetary limit may need to be set. After much discussion, it was decided to table this until next meeting.

B. Church Basement.

With the recent rains, the church basement has been flooding. The sump pump has been pumping all it can handle. Several men of the church have had to come and help get rid of the water. Concern is with the overall condition of the basement-with water draining behind the paneling-- dampness mold, mildew, rotting wood, etc. Especially, since we have discussed fixing it up for the youth and possibly for the cub scouts. Frank Lake contacted Walt Shealy who is a building contractor and helped build the HTLC. He is to come this Monday and evaluate the basement and water issue. This assessment will then be brought back to council by Property committee for further recommendations.

Property -

-The next property committee meeting is August 20th.

-At the parsonage -Moisture/humidity issue is currently on-going. Wilsons is evaluating this and HVAC and crawl space as well.

-Paint popping off window sills

-Light flickering in the sanctuary is now fixed.

Preschool -

-Preschool is planning their school opening August 28

Social Ministry -

GAAP needs volunteers for August 31

-Community meal is on-going.

-Homecoming is next up-coming event 3rd Sunday of September

Stewardship/Finance – Meeting in October to do budget for 2025. Will need all committees to turn in their budgets. It was also felt that there needed to be a contact person for each committee to help ensure this gets done. There was discussion regarding each committee/group being budgeted for a certain amount of money which is there for the committee if needed. If the money is not needed, then it is expected it should not be spent. It was also noted that most organizations/groups of the church turn in a financial report at end of each year but some are not doing this. Budget will be discussed next meeting.

Worship and Music - Will be meeting Tuesday August 20

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned with The Lord's Prayer.
